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What to look for

One move ends the game. Look at checks first, and only at checks: if it is mate in one, it is a check.

About these worksheets

This is one of three sheets for mate in one. The Easy and Intermediate sheets cover the same pattern at other rating bands. Thirteen other patterns are available the same way, including forks, pins, skewers, back rank mates, mate in one and smothered mate. All free, all with answer keys, no sign-up.

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The positions come from the free Reflex Chess trainer: 87 skills and 10,440 positions from real games, banded by rating, in a browser, offline, with no ads. Solving on paper is the half of this that builds calculation; the trainer is the half that tells you straight away whether you were right.
